
Reaching beyond

I. God saw Abraham as a potential man to fulfil His purpose in the world. (Acts 7: 2)

Yet God saw some hindrances in Abraham's life that would not allow him to fulfil God's purpose in life.

- Abraham's country
- His people
- His father's household

So, God promised Abraham that if he was prepared to separate himself from his old life and relationships, God would-

- Make him a new great nation
- Make his name great
- Make his life a blessing

All these promises that God gave him were in line with His plan of salvation for man. Nothing God does in the world is without His plan. The plan of God is "NONE SHOULD PERISH" So He chose a man from the heathenistic background and used him to become the father of many nations and the father of all who would believe in God. (Galatians 3:6 & 9)

II. Abraham's hesitation to move forward in faith. (Genesis 15:1-6)

There are events in Abraham's journey of faith that caused him to have some unnatural fear and doubt about the promises of God.

God promised Abraham a son - and in that line would come the Savior of the world. (Galatians 3:16)

Abraham not knowing where he was going but believing that the One who promised is faithful

5. NEVER ACCEPT FAILURE

(Failure is the first step to success). "Though the righteous man may fall seven times, he will get up. But the wicked will stumble into ruin." (Proverbs 24:16)

Men and women of faith do not give up. They can see the Promise in the dark.

"I will give you the treasures of darkness, riches stored in secret places, so that you may now that I am the Lord, the God of Israel, who summons you by name!" (Isaiah 45:3)

ANOTHER STORY OF FAITH

II Kings 13: 14 - 20

Elisha told the king of Israel, Jehoash to shoot the arrows into open air. (Vs. 15 - 17)

Then Elisha asked him to strike the ground with the arrows.

Jehoash did not realize that Elisha was testing his attitude toward what the prophet had asked him to do.

Sometimes, we think what God asks us to do does not make any sense.

Ministry does not make sense to some people if it's not a big assignment.

It is the ATTITUDE that counts in the ministry than your ABILITY

Elisha thought Jehoash would strike the ground at least 5 to 6 times but he quit tafter striking the ground 3 times. (People who quit too soon do not understand the significance of the word of God).

Go beyond your ability, beyond your capacity, to see the hidden truth in God's economy.
