

Complete relinquishment to the Master

Surrendering myself to the Lord's will has been something that has puzzled me for years. The idea of letting go of my self-centered desires and ambitions was not something I was ready to commit to. But in the heart, I wondered what it would feel like once I surrendered it all into His hands.

Sometime around the mid of June, an infographic for the youth camp came up. At first, I was extremely hesitant to go, since I preferred to be to myself and liked limited interactions with people. I remember my Mum recounting the testimonies of several people telling how their lives were changed after they attended a youth camp. I thought to myself - what's so special about a three-day youth camp that changes people's lives for the better? Surely there might be something more to it than that which meets the eye.

After a lot of hesitation and doubts, I decided to sign up for the camp and looking back, I'm thankful to the Lord for having taken that step. As the days grew nearer, my anxiety slowly started to cripple in. I questioned myself if it would actually be any good, and then decided to not think about it and let time do its thing. While on the bus, I prayed to the Lord, telling him to touch my heart in a way I'd never felt before- no expectations but hopeful that He would do something new.

During the first session of the camp that Friday evening, the theme that was bought forth by the pastor was faith, with an example of Abraham's response of "Here am I" when the Lord called him in Genesis 22. In that statement from Abraham's reply, we can understand that he was: ready to be taught, ready to obey, and lastly, he was ready to be examined by God. The last point struck a chord in me, making me realize that over the years I always expected God to work according to my wishes, but never let Him examine me when He called me to do His work.

At the end of the session, an altar call was made and the voice inside my head told me to go. At the altar as we continued to praise and worship, I felt the infilling of the Holy Spirit again and broke down crying: everything around me went silent, but in that silence, I felt this warmth and joy I had not felt in years. In those moments, I realized how much I missed being in His presence and being encompassed by His Spirit. Even though I felt His presence at that moment, I still was not ready to surrender it all. Then that night I prayed to the Lord that I wanted to feel that same presence and infilling with every session that followed.

Over the sessions that followed on Saturday, one message that was stuck in my head was how unforgiveness is an idol I find really hard to let go. In those moments, the Spirit brought to memory of multiple instances where I couldn't come to terms with forgiving people by whom I had been hurt. There stood the last idol between me and surrendering everything to the Lord. Convinced in the heart when the Spirit started infilling me again, I decided to let it all finally go. After it was over, I felt this weight lift off my
